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BYOB (Bring Your Own Banana)



Ingredients

To make 75 banana splits: 75 bananas 3 cans whipped cream 4, 4L vanilla ice cream 1 strawbery sauce 1 chocolate sauce additional toppings (if desired) 75 disposable spoons 75 disposable bowls 3 ice cream scoops

Help redefine BYOB (Bring Your Own Booze) by inviting students to bring their own banana and build a tasty treat. Activity doubles as a fundraiser too!

Method

1.Before the event:

- Write a letter to your local grocery store asking for a donation of materials.
- Advertise event. This may include making school announcements, creating posters, and social media posts (Be sure to include grocery store's logo if they sponsor event.).
- Presale to school staff. Be sure to charge accordingly.
 For example, \$5.00 without a banana, and \$4.00 with your own banana.
- 2. During event:
- Scoop three small scoops of ice cream into a disposable bowl.
- · Cut banana in half lengthwise. Add to bowl.
- Add toppings and sauces.
- Add a spoon.
- Serve.

3. After the event:

· Send a thank you card and event pictures to sponsor.

B.A.R.F. (Be a Responsible Friend) Bags



Ingredients

Brown paper bags

Sharpie markers

Items to place in bag (keychains, car wash coupons, water bottles, air freshners, gum, granola bars, seatbelt cutters, red ribbons, candy, etc.)

Stapler

Method

- Write a letter to be delivered to community businesses asking for donations towards event. See sample letter on next page.
- 2. Prepare brown paper bags.
- · Write B.A.R.F. Be a Responsible Friend on outside of bag.
- · Divide donated items amongst number of needed bags.
- · Fold over edge of bag and staple.

3. Deliver bags to driver's education graduates.

4. Send thank you cards to businesses/ people who donated.

Send a reminder to your school's driver's education graduates (Grade 10 class) using a play on the word "BARF". September 28th, 2022

Ingredients

200 (or more) boxes of potato chips

Method

- 1. Order boxes of potato chips from Old Dutch.
- 2. Prepare fundraiser form.
- 3. Advertise fundraiser.
- 4. Map out door-to-door routes for SADD members.
- 5. Sell boxes of potato chips to local community residents. \$20.00 per box.

Grim Reaper White Out Day



Ingredients

Printed sign that includes a description of person's death

String to hang sign around person's neck

Music (e.g., sirens) to play over intercom

Grim reaper costume

Method

- 1. Research stories of impaired driving deaths.
- 2. Preselect students who would take event seriously.
- 3. Make up signs that include description of impaired driving deaths.
- 4. Every 30 minutes starting at 9:00 AM, play the music over the school intercom. At this time, have the grim reaper (a SADD student dressed in costume) pick one of the preselected students to die. Grim reaper reads sign description out loud to the class that the student is in before leaving. Student hangs sign around their neck and cannot talk for the rest of the day.
- 5. Repeat step 4 until the school day ends.
- 6. Host a school wide assembly to summarize event.

An impactful awareness activity meant to show students what it would be like if one of their friends was no longer in their life because of impaired driving.

Impaired Obstacle Course



Ingredients

Drunk Goggles from SADD Saskatchewan

Materials for obstacle course (e.g., Basketballs, badminton rackets and birdies, scooters, pylons, mats, etc.)

Participation prizes

Let students experience what it is like to be drunk using Fatal Vision Alcohol Impairment goggles.

Method

- 1. Request to borrow Fatal Vision Alcohol Impairment goggles from SADD Saskatchewan.
- 2. Get permission from school administration to host event.
- 3. Book school gym.
- 4. Advertise event. See sample poster on next page.
- 5. On day of event, set up obstacles. These may include:
- · Walk a straight line.
- · Shooting baskets.
- Badminton rally.
- Mat maze.
- · Pylon weave on scooters.
- Scooter race
- 4. Invite participants to come and take part.
- 5. Ensure safety of all participants.
- 6. Offer a participation prize for those who take part.
- 7. Clean up obstacle course.

Ingredients

1 bale (500 bags) of undecorated liquor bags Decorating materials (markers, pencil crayons, gel pens, crayons, etc.)

Method

- 1. Pick up a bale of liquor bags from your local liquor store.
- 2. Decorate liquor bags with holiday images and SADD slogans (See sample slogans on next page).
- 3. Invite SADD and non SADD students to help decorate liquor bags. Elementary students are awesome decorators!
- 4. Deliver bags back to liquor store before the holidays.

Master Chef Mocktails



Ingredients

Drink supplies (Sprite, lemonade, orange juice, grenadine, cherries, fruit (limes, lemons, oranges, etc.), etc.

Brown lunch bags

Cups

Gross materials from the teachers' fridge (e.g., ranch, soya sauce, hot sauce, ketchup, etc.)

Prizes

Bring awareness to your SADD Chapter by hosting a mocktail competition.

Method

- 1. Advertise event.
- 2. Decide maximum number of teams that can participate.
- 3. Prepare a sign-up sheet and hang at the main office.
- 4. Invite teams of 2 to sign up at the main office.
- 5. Find three judges for the competition. These may be teachers, interns, or community members.
- 6. Gather supplies.

Round 1:

- 1. Line up drink supplies.
- 2. Give each team 30 seconds to pick their drink supplies. Set a limit of 3 items.
- 3. Give each team 10 minutes to make their drink.
- 4. Ask judges to judge drinks.

Round 2:

- 1. Hide "gross" materials in brown lunch bags. One per bag.
- 2. Give each team 30 seconds to pick no more than 3 hidden gross materials.
- 3. Give each team 10 minutes to make their drink.
- 4. Ask judges to judge "gross" drinks.
- 5. Award prize(s) to winning team(s).



Mock Disaster



Ingredients

Crashed vehicle

Community Partners: Tow truck driver, RCMP, Fire Department, Funeral Director, EMS, etc.

Student actors/ actresses

Cosmetology Class/ Teacher

Crash sound to be played over school intercom

An unforgettable way to involve the community emergency response team and show the dangers of impaired driving.

Method

- 1. Ask school administration for permission to host event.
- 2. Advertise (in both the school and community) the date and time of the mock disaster.
- Plan mock disaster with community emergency response team (Tow truck driver, RCMP, Fire, EMS, Funeral Director, etc.). Be sure to invite the local newspaper to cover the event.
- 4. Preselect student actors/ actresses to have roles in mock disaster.
- 5. Ask the cosmetology teacher/ class to do special effects makeup on student actors/ actresses.
- 6. Stage disaster scene. Pick a location near school.
- When ready, play a crash sound over school intercom, and then invite all staff and students to the location of the disaster.



Red Ribbon Rampage



Ingredients

Red ribbons

Method

- 1. Request red ribbons from SADD Saskatchewan.
- Tie red ribbons onto vehicles. Pick populous places like the staff parking lot, teachers' parking lot, shopping mall, grocery store parking lot, etc.

A very simple way to spread SADD's message.

School Dance



Ingredients

Decorations (table clothes, paper snowflakes, Christmas trees, etc.)

DJ

Supplies for popcorn and mocktails

Door prize

Method

- 1. Get permission from school administration to host a school dance.
- 2. Book a DJ.
- 3. Advertise event. See sample posters on next page.
- 4. Make/ buy/ borrow decorations.
- 5. Buy supplies to make popcorn and mocktails.
- 6. On the night of the dance, decorate your dance space (e.g., cafeteria, gym, etc.).
- 7. Charge admission (\$5.00 per person. Includes one free popcorn or mocktail and an entry into the door prize.)
- $8. \ensuremath{\mathsf{Make}}$ popcorn and mocktails. Sell each for \$2.00.
- 9.Dance!
- 10. Clean up.

Show students that you can have fun without drinking by hosting a winter formal.
